Constitutional Amendment Research Project

You will be assigned a constitutional amendment. Working in groups, you will research a current event/issue through which the assigned amendment is being challenged, debated, or otherwise discussed. After researching your current event, you will put together a PowerPoint presentation that follows the guidelines stated below.

Guidelines

- 1. Your presentation should clearly state the amendment you have been assigned, a definition of the amendment, the current event/issue you are researching, and how the amendment is being challenged/debated/discussed through this event/topic.
- 2. PowerPoints should include a balance of both text and images. Content should be organized and clear.
- 3. Each group member will need to present at least one slide. Prepare your slide ahead of time; do not just read directly off the slide.
- 4. Your presentation should be approx. 5-7 minutes in length, with time for guestions from the class.
- 5. If your current event/issue revolves around a debate over an amendment, include a discussion of both sides of the debate.

Research Guidelines

Below are some questions you can ask yourself to guide and organize your research:

- 1. What does my assigned amendment do? What rights does it protect, what measures does it put into place, or what does it prevent?
- 2. What is a current issue or event that is relevant to my assigned amendment?
- 3. In relation to the current issue or event, is the amendment being challenged, debated, or discussed?
- 4. What is being challenged, debated, or discussed about this amendment in relation to the current event/issue?
