2. Proclamation Line of 1763	B. British document written in 1215 to limit the power of the King and give more power to the British subjects
3. Treaty of Paris 1763	C. Enforced the collection of taxes on sugar and molasses
4. Mercantilism	D. A pamphlet published by Thomas Paine in which he argued the colonists should be free from British rule
5. Salutary Neglect	E. An alliance of colonies proposed by Benjamin Franklin during the lead-up to the French & Indian War; modeled on the Iroquois League
6. Sugar Act (1764)	F. Imaginary boundary along the Appalachian Mountains established by the British to keep colonists from moving west onto Native American lands
7. Albany Plan of Union	G. Treaty ending the French & Indian War; gave Britain control over French territory in North America
8. Coercive Acts	H. Law-making assembly made up of local colonial representatives
9. Common Sense	I. A series of acts passed by the British to punish the Massachusetts for the Boston Tea Party
10. Magna Carta	J. Britain's unofficial policy towards its colonies, where it did not interfere in colonial affairs
